## **ORDINANCES:**

Parrott moved to not change the contract with Jim's Sanitation for garbage & recycling by allowing request to discontinue service during winter or vacancies as they had upfront costs involved to serve an estimated number of customers they used to bid the contract. Williams seconded the motion. Roll call votes of ayes: Hill, Cunningham, Burger, Williams and Parrott. Motion carried. Hill moved to place Ordinance No. 232 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE

CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF AFTON, IOWA, 1998, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO SOLID WASTE COLLECTION AND TRANSPORTATION on its 2<sup>nd</sup> reading. Parrott seconded the motion. Roll call votes of ayes: Burger, Parrott, Cunningham, Williams and Hill. Motion carried.

Williams moved to place Ordinance No. 233 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF AFTON, IOWA, 1998, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO SOLID WASTE CONTROL on its 2<sup>nd</sup> reading. Parrott seconded the motion. Roll call votes of ayes: Williams, Cunningham, Parrott, Hill and Burger. Motion carried.

Hill moved to place Ordinance No. 234 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF AFTON, IOWA, 1998, BY AMENDING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO PARKING REGULATIONS on its 1<sup>st</sup> reading with changes discussed. Cunningham seconded the motion. Roll call votes of ayes: Parrott, Cunningham, Williams, Burger and Hill. Motion carried.

## **OLD BUSINESS:**

Nuisance list provided by Chief Coulter was reviewed. Council discussed procedure they would like done with items and Chief Coulter will be getting forms from attorney and serving several tickets on junk and junk vehicles. Coulter will serve 251 N Webster again and if not completed in timeframe the City will board up broken windows and assess cost to property. 404 W. Polk was discussed and owner does not have ability to finish cleanup of foundation and has offered deed to lot to City via their attorney's discussion with the City attorney. Parrott moved to allow deed to be transferred to City. Burger seconded the motion. All voted aye and the motion carried. If transfer is completed the City will finish cleanup and fill in and level lot.

Hill moved to appoint Ben Clear to the Recreation Board (3 year term to expire 9/1/19). Williams seconded the motion. All voted aye and the motion carried.

## **NEW BUSINESS:**

Rick Paxton with the Afton Lion's Club was present to discuss the need for more electric outlets in the park to use for the Pre 4<sup>th</sup> celebration. They would like outlets added on the west side, middle and east side of the City park. Williams moved to grant the request and have outlets added and Hill seconded the motion. All voted aye and the motion carried.

Williams moved to approve El Ranchito liquor license renewal once all paperwork has been completed. Burger seconded the motion. All voted aye and the motion carried.

Council reviewed revision to the Employee Handbook. Maintenance hours were changed and the new medical changes were made. Parrott moved to approve the revisions to the Employee Handbook and Williams seconded the motion. All voted aye and the motion carried.

Cunningham moved to reappoint Larry Swanson to the Planning and Zoning Board (5 year term to expire 11/12/21). Burger seconded the motion. All voted aye and the motion carried.

The Union County Supervisors requested permission to leave the recycling bin in Afton as of January 1<sup>st</sup> (City will have curbside recycling and planned to remove the bin) at the Counties expense for a trial period of 6 months to see how the usage is and if they need to keep it available to eastern union county residents. Williams moved to allow the request and Hill seconded the motion. All voted aye and the motion carried.

Council members turned in their completed SICOG CED (Comprehensive Economic Development) survey. The City Clerk will tally the results and submit to SICOG electronically.

Council reviewed Chapter 25-Police Department. No changes were made to the ordinance.

Council will discuss Chapter 22-City Attorney at the December meeting.

Parrott moved to adjourn and Williams seconded the motion. All voted aye. Council adjourned at 7:33 PM.
