The Afton City Council met in regular scheduled session at 6:30 PM November 14, 2017. Mayor Burger presided with Council members Dave Cunningham, Sherry Parrott, Mary Hill, Cindy Williams and Jeff Burger present.

Parrott moved to approve the agenda and Hill seconded the motion. All voted aye. Motion carried. Parrott moved to approve the consent agenda which consisted of the minutes of October 10, 2017 meeting, report of the City Clerk/Treasurer, Police Chief Report and the following bills. Cunningham seconded the motion. All voted aye. Motion carried.

PUBLIC HEARING: At 6:32 PM Mayor Burger announced it was time for the Public Hearing on the Budget Amendment for the Fiscal Year 2017-18 City Budget. No one present spoke and no one had contacted City Hall regarding the amendment. Mayor Burger closed the hearing at 6:33 PM.

PUBLIC FORUM: No one present spoke.

RESOLUTIONS/ORDINANCES:

Hill moved to approve Resolution 2017-21 A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE CURRENT BUDGET FOR THE FISCAL YEAR ENDING JUNE 30, 2018. Williams seconded the motion. Roll call votes of ayes: Parrott, Burger, Hill, Williams and Cunningham. Motion carried.

Parrott moved to place Ordinance #235 AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THE CODE OF ORDINANCES OF THE CITY OF AFTON, IOWA, 1998, BY AMENDING, ADDING AND REPEALING PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO LIVESTOCK REGULATIONS on its 2nd reading. Williams seconded the motion. Roll call votes of ayes: Burger, Parrott, Williams, Cunningham and Hill. Motion carried. Afton resident Melanie Beaman was present and asked questions regarding the new livestock ordinance and mentioned she had an unseen disability and has a doctor's note for her horses. The new ordinance with application process was explained.

Hill moved to waive the 3rd reading of Ordinance #235 and Parrott seconded the motion. Roll call votes of ayes: Hill, Cunningham, Burger, Williams and Parrott. Motion carried.

Williams moved to approve Ordinance #235 and Parrott seconded the motion. Roll call votes of ayes: Hill, Burger, Parrott, Cunningham and Williams. Motion carried.

OLD BUSINESS:

Police Chief Coulter reviewed his nuisance report with the Council. Horses have been removed from 708 E. Grand. He noted paperwork submitted to court on 501 W. Filmore and 111 E. Filmore and the trailer park has started removal of abandoned trailers. Hill mentioned several properties have indoor furniture outside. Coulter will drive around and get address and serve those properties.

JEO Consulting Group has given the City 3 options on opinion of construction costs for running primary electric service to the fairgrounds. Option 1 for three phase at \$65,986.55, option 2 with single phase and transformers on north side of Filmore and south side of fairgrounds for \$36,801.13 and option 3 with single phase and moving north side transformer 2 spans south into the fairgrounds approximately 235' and 1 on south side of fairgrounds for \$45,051.26. Council discussed all options with Ben Adamson & Dan Stephens from the fair board and Kurt Sharp, builder on what will work best. Williams moved to approve and proceed with Option 3. Hill seconded the motion. All voted in favor. Motion carried.

NEW BUSINESS:

Parrott moved to approve El Ranchito's liquor license renewal. Williams seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Two bids were reviewed to remove a dead ash tree at 621 E. Scott. Bids of \$500 and \$800 for tree and stump removal were received. The City will pay ½ and homeowner ½ since the tree is on both private property and city right-of-way. Burger moved to approve paying ½ of the bid of \$500 received from McNeill Tree Service. Williams seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Parrott moved to appoint Jennifer Jackson and Clinton Haight to replace Amber Tate and Lindsay Eklund with terms through 9/1/18 on the Recreation Board. Cunningham seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Cunningham moved to pay \$100 each to Monte Parrott, Jake McGuire and the Afton Fire Department for help unplugging the sewer main on E. Grand. Burger seconded the motion. Parrott abstained and all other members voted in favor and the motion carried. It was noted that Monte Parrott helped run the sewer machine and Jake McGuire shuttled water back and forth using the grass fire truck from around 2 PM to 8 PM on 10/17/17 and again from 9 AM to 2 PM on 10/18/17. All agreed payment to them meets a public purpose for their above listed help.

Hill moved to approve Schedule C listing new rates from Southwest Iowa Rural Electric rates for their quarterly and annual inspections of our substation. Burger seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried. The quarterly inspection will increase \$7.50 and annual \$8.75.

City Clerk Landers updated the Council on the County Road projects. Zach Gunsolley, Union County Engineer, had called to let Afton know about projects that will be going on in our area next year (summer 2018). High School Drive and the County section of E. Grand will both have micro-surfacing done and the Creamery Road will be milled and new asphalt laid. They will be doing DOT bid letting in January so we should know what companies will be doing the job and in our areas to bid any street projects we have next summer.

Parrott moved to add the new Safety Group Cyber Liability Program to our EMC Insurance renewal in April. Williams seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Parrott moved to approve Utility Clerk Walter attend the Energy Conference on November 29-30 in Altoona. Cunningham seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Cunningham moved to approve the Southern Iowa Tourism ad for \$145.50 with a couple additions to the list on our ad. Parrott seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Council reviewed the City renewal for our Wellmark BC/BS health and dental plan. The rate increased 24.01%. Other alternate plans were discussed. Parrott moved to change plans from our current \$1,000 deductible and \$2,000 out of pocket to a \$1500 deductible and \$3,000 out of pocket plan with a 16.86% increase. Burger seconded the motion. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Council turned their SICOG Comprehensive Economic Development Strategy survey's into Clerk Landers to tabulate and complete the survey online for the City.

Parrott moved to adjourn and Burger seconded the motion. All voted aye. Council adjourned at 7:29 PM.
