

**156.03 BUILDING CODE.** The provisions of the International Building Code, 2018 edition, as published by the International Code Council, are hereby adopted, subject to the following additions, modifications, insertions, and deletions:

- 1. **Section 101.1 Title.** Delete existing text and insert: "These regulations shall be known as the Afton Building Code, hereinafter referred to as "this code"."

Where a fire alarm system is installed, actuation of the automatic sprinkler system shall actuate the building fire alarm system."

- 25. **Section 1807.1.5 Concrete and masonry foundation walls.** Add Exception #2 and Table 1807.1.5: "2. Concrete and masonry foundation walls supporting buildings of conventional light-frame wood construction shall be permitted to be designed in accordance with Table 1807.1.5.



66.01 Temporary Embargo 66.02 Permits for Excess Size and Weight 66.03 Load Limits Upon Certain Streets 66.04 Truck Routes

66.01 TEMPORARY EMBARGO. If the Council declares an embargo when it appears by reason of deterioration, rain, snow or other climatic conditions that certain streets will be seriously damaged or destroyed by vehicles weighing in excess of an amount specified by the signs, no such vehicles shall be operated on streets so designated by such signs.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.471 & 472)

66.02 PERMITS FOR EXCESS SIZE AND WEIGHT. The Police Chief may, upon application and good cause being shown, issue a special permit in writing authorizing the applicant to operate or move a vehicle or combination of vehicles of a size or weight or load exceeding the maximum specified by State law or the City over those streets or bridges named in the permit which are under the jurisdiction of the City and for which the City is responsible for maintenance.

(Code of Iowa, Sec. 321.473 & 321E)

**66.03 LOAD LIMITS UPON CERTAIN STREETS.** When signs are erected giving notice thereof, no person shall operate any vehicle with a gross weight in excess of the amounts specified on such signs at any time upon any of the following streets or parts of streets:
